



Community Research between the Ouse and Derwent.


- Working with community groups in North Duffield and Cawood over 10 years.

- Growing data set from commercial work near Wheldrake, Hemmingbrough, Barlby and of course Heslington.






Plan showing approximate sites from aerial survey, excavations and glacial moraines.

- Eventiually published online as 'A Perfect Flat.. Understanding the archaeology of the Vale of York'.




Community Projects... at North Duffield and Cawood

- Margaret too ran a community project at Cawood supported by Selby Borough Council (as it was set up a few years ago)




Continuity from Iron Age into Romano British?

- In the Ouse and Derwent area we didn't identify high status activity.
- Middle Iron Age into Romano British sites at Hemmingbrough and North Duffield displayed intensive but scattered settlement.
- In the case of North Duffield displaying some quite large round houses set in enclosed field systems.
- Our Roundhouse went out of use before or at the time of the appearance of the Romans in the landscape.
- There was evidence for a realignment of some of these fields but not a revolution in rural activity.








Enclosed Farm Stead Communities

- At North Duffield and Wheldrake we were also able to investigate more intensely occupied enclosures.
- These suggested many phased housing and possible storage.
- The example at North Duffield started in the Iron Age and continued into the Romano British. Only changing in the middle of the Romano British.
- We also observed but didn't excavate a similar enclosure at Cawood.



North Duffield Enclosure






















What about Villas between Ouse and

Derwent?

- The aerial surveys and archaeological excavation have not encountered high status Romano British sites between the rivers.
- There are local tales of potential high-status sites that might suggest further investigation.
- Does this however, suggest the hand of control in this landscape from Eboracum? Is it a Territorium?
