A Walk Around Fishergate's History



Fishergate is often overlooked by visitors heading for the city centre, but archaeological discoveries have revealed a fascinating history.


Fawcett Street and Fulford Road follow a Roman Road and Roman burials have been found nearby. A craft manufacturing and trading community lived here long before the Norman Conquest, food for the city was grown on adjacent fields and the river Foss provided fishing and a safe harbour.

Three medieval churches and a priory were demolished in the 16th century and the community dispersed, leaving open fields, market gardens, orchards and windmills.

Modern Fishergate began with canalisation of the River Foss and new industry in the 19th century.




