I William Hotham of Fulford in the county of York Esquire under the
authority on "The consecration of a "Church Yards Act 1867" do
hereby in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds
sterling to me paid by the Reverend Henry Marcus Clifford Vicar of
Fulford are resaid grant and covey unto the person or persons or
corporation sole or aggregate in whom the church yard or burial
place known as Fulford Church Yard in the said county of York is
now vested his or their heirs or successors **all that** piece or
parcel of grass land adjoining the Church Lane of Fulford aforesaid
containing by admeasurement one rood and eight perches be the
same more or less **and all** that cottage or tenement with the barn
stables and hereditaments now standing and being thereon and
late in occupation of John Brown but now in the occupation of
Charles Meeld (or Muld). Which said piece or parcel of land

cottage barn stables and hereditaments are bounded on or towards the north by the church yard of Fulford aforesaid on or towards the East by a lane leading thereto on or towards the south by a road called Church Lane and on or towards the west by land belonging to the said William Hotham and which said premises are more particularly delineated and described on the plan thereof drawn on the back of these presents and thereon coloured pink and all right title and interest in the same and every part thereof to be held for ever as part of the said church yard or burial place in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twentieth - day of December - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine.
