Lease and Release 29 – 30 of April 1745 Mr Oates and Mr Taylor in Consideration of £52-19-0 to John Taylor and 10 shillings to Sancton [?] Taylor his Mother they did Convey to Mr Oates All the Manor of Fulford (His freehold Messuages and Lands not therein mentioned excepted) to hold the same unto the said Robert Oates to the use of the said John Taylor's Life and then to the use of the said Robert Oates subject then to a free rent of £6 to Mr Wench [?] as a proportion of £19-13-0 a year payable by Mr Taylor. Mr Oates and his Mother did confirm to Mr Taylor a Rent charge of £1 10-11-6 free from all taxes and deductions Issuing [?] out of Water Foulford Estate in General payable at Michelmas and Lady day which was payed up to the date of this release whence the[y] mutually agree to release to John Key all the said Manor etc and also 4 other Closes called Abbey Croft Hill and one other Close called Pill Moor Close subject to payment of £6 a year to the Minister at Fulford and £2 a year to the Minister and poor of Christ Church

and also subject after John T[aylor's] death to £6 as a proportion part of a Free rent and in consideration thereof J[ohn] K[ey] agrees to pay J Taylor for his life £320 yearly and £805 in hand paid [when?] he conveys a Messuage House Garth etc. and Great Abbey Crofts, Little Abbey Crofts, Abbey Croft Nook, German Close, Newfield, London Close, part of another London Close and Halfpeney Row another messuage garths and 1 Newfield, part of 2 Newfield and part of 3 Newfield, Abbey Croft Bottom, Sh[o]ulder of Mutton, Mattinson's Newfield and also all that Messuage and Garth etc. and 2 Closes called Newfield/Exelbys and also the right of Landing and all Land Allott[ed?] to Mr Taylor for Life and after to Mr Oates All that right of Landing shoring Lime Coals or sand and Goods upon that piece of waste Ground left for that purpose Jointly with the several Proprietors of Allotments within the Township of Fulford

John Taylor quits Claim of the £110-11-6 Issuing out of West Fulford but has the annual sum of £320 free from Land Tax and all other deductions at 4 Quarterly payments, 5 July, 5 Oct, 5 January,

5 April at 12 o'clock at Noon and a part of a [illegible word] that shall be due to John T[aylor] at his Death

John Taylor agrees to produce in Court the probate of the Will of John Taylor the Grandfather Dated August the 10th 1699 and the probate of the will of his Father Dated June 17th 1715 and a Deed Dated 2 June 1769 between him and his wife Fanney[?] and also the True[Fine?] Indenture ???ed in Easter Term 9[?] George second. The £320 a year now charged upon the Manor and Lands in Gate Fulford. I have perused and setteled the annexed Draft and do approve of it as a proper Assuarance for the several purposes intended by the parties.

As to the Title I observe that by the will of John T[aylor] the Grandfather in 1699 - £3,000 are charged upon the whole Estate of Fulford for his younger children portions[?], it is very probable they have been long since paid, but it would be satisfactory to have releases produced, I observe also that in the will of Thomas Taylor Father of the present Mr T[aylor] mention is made of £300 which had been lent to T[homas] T[aylor] the Grandfather and that for securing thereof part of the Estate was conveyed to Trustees to the uses mentioned in certain Articles of Agreement made in relation to Thomas and his wife imeadiately after their Marriage, It should be made appear that that those uses are satisfied or detained for though the Articles are said to be made after Marriage yet being for a valuable Consideration of Money lent they would be good against purchases, These points being cleared up I apprehend the Totls [Totals?] will be very good. – P Johnson 16 August 1773

The Mayor and Comonality of the City of York of the third part

The Reverend Benjamin Wilson, Thomas Norton, Richard Buxton, William Charnock and William Nevinson, Feoffees of land in Gate Fulford in Trust for the maintenance of a School at Fremington in Swaledale and for other charitable purposes of the fourth part

Robert Oates of Water Fulford, Francis Barlow of Middlethorpe, William Richardson of Gate Fulford, Edward Stabler of Gate Fulford, Barnard Ackroyd of York, Brewer, and several other Persons whose names and seals are thereunto subscribed and set of the fifth part

Lands in Gate Fulford:-

One large Common Field of 300 acres of uninclosed land

One lesser Common Field of 30 acres of uninclosed land

Common Meadow- grounds called the Ings of 50 acres

Extensive Commons or Waste Grounds known as the East Moor and the West Moor of 400 acres

The Manor or Lordship of Fulford includes the Township of Gate Fulford and part of Water Fulford. John Taylor is the Lord of the Manor of Fulford and owns several Messuages, Cottages, Frontsteads and lands in the Manor

Page 2

Francis Meek was entitled, through the Improprate Rectory of Gate Fulford, to the Tythes, Mortuaries and Ecclesiastical dues from the lands and tenements in the Manor of Fulford and he nominated the Minister or Curate of Fulford

The Common or Waste Grounds belonged to John Taylor and to all other owners and occupiers of ancient Messuages, Cottages and Frontsteads in the Manor who have the right of stray and average in the Common Fields and also in several inclosures which had been taken from the Common Fields

Freemen of the City of York who own Messuages in the Walmgate Ward have the right of stray and average in the said Common Fields and also the right of intercommoning, these rights being vested in the Mayor and Commonality for the benefit of such Freemen

Robert Oates, Francis Barlow, William Richardson, Edward Stabler, Barnard Ackroyd and several others own ancient Messuages, Cottages, Frontsteads and Lands in the Manor

It was agreed by all that the Common Fields, Ings, and Commons or Waste Grounds should be divided between the Proprietors thereof and Persons interested therein and all the Inclosures should be held and enjoyed in severality and freed from all Right of Commonality and Average and together with all other Tythable Grounds, Lands and Tenements in the Manor should be exempt from all Tythes and Ecclesiastical dues (except for those belonging to the Minister or Curate of Fulford). Francis meek should be paid compensation in cash or by the allotment of lands or yearly payments or both as seen fit by the Commissioners

Page 3

Part of West Moor known as The Low Moor containing 80 acres of ground should be allotted to the Mayor and Commonality of the City of York in Trust for the Freemen owning Messuages in the Walmgate Ward in lieu of the right of stray, average and intercommoning in the said Common Fields, Inclosures and Commons to which they were formerly entitled

Commissioner appointed:-

Robert Bewlay of the City of York

Richard Mason of the City of York

Samuel Milbourn of Kerby-Grindalyth in the County of York

Duties of the Commissioners:-

They were to ensure that an accurate survey of the Common Fields, Ings and Commons or Waste Grounds should be completed within 12 months

After completion of the survey they were to pay compensation to Francis Meek for his loss of Tythes by the allotment of lands equivalent to the value of the Tythes,

Page 4

or by the payment of a cash sum to be charged on all the lands to be exempted from the payment of Tythes in due and equal proportion or by the payment of yearly rents charges on the same lands in the same way

Owners of Messuages, Cottages and Frontsteads who do not own any land but have rights of stray and average should be allotted land or paid compensation charged on the proprietors of lands in the Common Fields in due and equal proportion

The rest of the Common Fields and Ings should be divided among the owners and proprietors by the Commissioners in proportion to the amount of land they own

Page 5

One acre of land to be set aside to provide sand and gravel to repair the highways in the township of Gate Fulford

The part of the Commons or Waste Ground known as Low Moor to be allotted to the Mayor and Commonality of the City of York in Trust for the Freemen of the City occupying Messuages in the

Walmgate Ward to be enjoyed by them in severality for ever, exclusive of all other persons and free from Tythes, in compensation for giving up all rights to the Common Fields, Commons and old Inclosures of Gate Fulford

Low Moor was to be depastured from 12/May to 10/Oct each year. Each person was allowed to graze one gelding, one mare and one foal under two years or one cow and one calf under two years

The residue of the Commons or Waste Grounds should be divided between the owners of Messuages, Cottages and Frontsteads of the Manor. The share of each owner of a messuage or frontstead where a messuage had been will be double the share of the owner of a cottage or frontstead where a cottage had been. No regard to made to the lands of any owner or to the size or state of the house

An allotment to be made to John Taylor and the Lords of the Manor of Fulford sufficient to provide an income of £4 per annum to pay the salary of the Minister or Curate, at that time paid by the Impropiator of the Rectory [Francis Meek]

Page 6

The Commissioners may exchange Inclosures lying at a distance from the Village of Gate Fulford for inclosures of equal quantity and quality nearer the Village

Other exchanges of Inclosures or Messuages, Cottages, Frontsteads, Garths and Crofts may be made with the written consent of the parties concerned

Allotments by the Commissioners must be impartial

The Commissioners have the power to set out public and private Ways and Roads, and Ditches, Fences, Drains, Bridges, Gates and Stiles (public Highways to be at least 40 feet wide) and to say by whome they should be constructed and repaired. They had the power to divide and alter water courses

The public and common highways to be repaired by the Township of Gate Fulford and it would be unlawful for anyone to use any other highways, plant a tree within 10 yards of a highway of turn sheep into any of the lanes for a period of 7 years

Page 7

The fence round Low Moor to be repaired by those who use the moor and those who do not pay their share shall be excluded from the moor until they pay. Anyone moving from the Ward and still owing money may have their goods confiscated and sold. Such persons had the right to appeal to the Quarter Sessions if they felt aggrieved

The Commissioners are to make their Awards within 2 years of the Survey.

Page 7/8

They should also ascertain how much compensation should be paid to:-

Francis Meek for the Tythes due to him and determine how the money should be raised and when it should be paid.

The owners of Messuages etc who do not own land to compensate them for loss of their Right of Stray etc. and to be paid by the proprietors of the Common Fields

Owners and Occupiers for damage caused by the making of Fences Ditches or Drains on another person's wheat or barley land

They should make Orders concerning the building of Roads and Ways and Fences, Ditches etc. and all such Orders and Directions necessary for the Division and Inclosure

Their final Award should be recorded on parchment and deposited in the Public Record Office of the East Riding of Yorkshire

After the Division and Award all rights of Common, Stray or Average should cease and all the lands should be free from Tythes (except for the Surplice-Fees and Easter Offerings belonging to the Curate or Minister of Fulford)

Page 9

If a farmer quits his farm between Lady-day before or May-day after the Award and be entitled to the summer crop of the farm quitted his landlord would have the right to take Tythes in kind from that crop

Proprietors have to accept the Allotments within 6 months of the Award, failing or refusing to do would exclude them from any of the benefits of the division with the following exceptions :-
The executors in Trust, Guardians, Husbands etc. of Minors, persons under Coverture or beyond the Seas etc. should accept on behalf of such people. If they fail to do so the incapable person may claim and accept within a year of their incapacity being removed

No Deed, Will, Settlement or Lease shall be revoked or annulled by any of this

Each proprietor is to fence and ditch his own property at his own expence

If any money for the purchase of the Tythes from Francis Meek is not paid, the Commissioners can raise the money by the Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of the person refusing to pay or Francis Meek can take the rents, issues and profits of their lands until the money plus expenses are paid

In all future Rates, Levies and Assessments made in Gate Fulford the Lands or Rents allotted to Francis Meek in lieu of Tythes shall be assessed as other lands in the Township

If any owners of lands refuse to pay compensation for the loss of rights of stray etc to the owners of Messuages etc. not owning lands in the Common Fields, the money can be raised by the Distress and Sale of the Goods and Chattels of such owners
